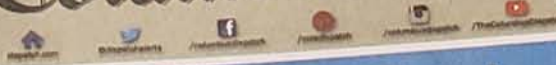

## Americans more often die at home than hospital

For the first time in more than 50 years, more Americans are dying at home than in hospitals — a shift that care providers in Ohio say they saw coming. As of 2017, 29.8% of natural deaths occurred in hospitals, while 30.7% happened in homes, according to a study published this month in *The New England Journal of Medicine*. The journal found that 20.8% of people died in nursing homes. That slim margin between
