The new menu features a re-investigation of the American hamburger, Chinese Steamed Buns, also known as Bao, and a pagoda concept that adds new (invent) but the Toledo-culinary scene. Traditionally, the buns are stuffed or served folded over the ingredients similar to an open faced taco, but Balance chefs take another approach, using steam heat for steaks in the distinct presentation.
