Opposition period

If anyone opposes the registration decision, the registration can be revoked in whole or in part. Such opposition must be received by the Swedish Patent- and Registration Office within three months from the Publication date.

A trademark registration is valid for ten years

A trademark registration is valid for ten years from the date of registration. Thereafter, the registration may be renewed for another ten year period. Applications for renewal can be made at the earliest one year before the ten-year period expires, and with an extra fee, within six months thereafter. The fee must be paid within the same period.
