One in five children is living with a mental illness, and 50 percent of all lifetime mental illnesses start by age

Further troubling, only one child psychiatrist is available for every 15,000 youths younger than 18. The On Our Sleeves movement, launched on World Mental Health Day 2018, is on a national mission to break the silence surrounding children's mental health. All content and resources have been developed with the mental health experts at Nationwide Children's Hospital. On Our Sleeves has created a network of support around the millions of families around the country living with mental illness by addressing the stigma associated with this diagnosis and providing the tools necessary to improve behavioral health outcomes.

In addition to advocacy and education, On Our Sleeves supports accelerating Behavioral Health research with a focus on Nationwide Children's Hospital, which operates the nation's largest program for child and
