The Public Sector Must Play a Role

Public sector must act where the private is unable to: as in the case of taking risks for the setup of initiatives which impact the common good and require collective engagement, being too costly, high risk and long term for private sector to kickstart it.

It requires a core team creating an exciting, action-oriented, and supportive startup community including entrepreneurs and entrepreneurial-minded people.

Stockholm: STING

Founded in 2002 and creating the greatest startup ecosystem success story

Helsinki: Maria

In 2014 entrepreneurs started Maria, Slush, etc.: ranked 31 and creating large exits with <750 startups

Amsterdam: Startup Amsterdam

Started in 2014 and codified and improved the model of STING and others for taking leadership and building momentum

Frankfurt: TechQuartier

Founded in 2016 and already having a very clear impact

Set of Initiatives

1. Research to understand how certain people and organizations have a disproportional impact on the development of communities, business ecosystems, and startup ecosystems;
2. Publication of content on community building and how community builders, whether individuals or organizations, can have a great impact;
3. Consulting and coaching services in order for cities to develop Keystone teams to accelerate the development of business and innovation ecosystems as well as startup ecosystems;
4. Institute where we learn from each other and share playbook and resources, leverage our network for each other.


