- 2. A crisis that requires immediate action.

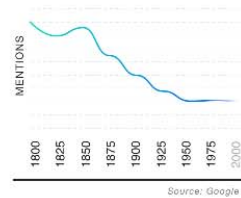


### Examples of *Exigency* in a sentence

"The exigency of the natural disaster inspired many people to make donations and volunteer their time."

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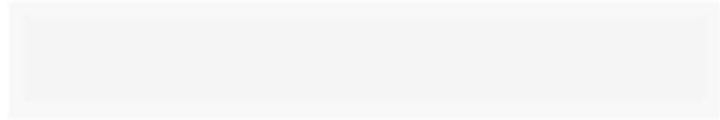


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
