PREPAREDNESS

Convoy of Hope's response team provides field and preparedness training to individuals across the country interested in disaster response.

MONITORING

We constantly monitor developing weather situations, earthquake activity, wildfires and other forms of natural disasters from the Operations Center at our World Distribution Center in Springfield, Missouri.

ASSESSMENT

We consistently send assessment teams to the field to gauge our level of response. In many instances, our teams are among the first on the ground.

RESPONSE

Our response team provides immediate relief following disasters through the bulk distribution of emergency relief supplies like food, water, cleaning supplies and hygiene kits.

RECOVERY

We organize volunteers to assist homeowners with cleanup and debris removal in the days, weeks and sometimes months following a disaster.
