Offen overlooke are the water and cost savings achievable with retrofiting domestic valer devices such as tolets, urinals, sink faucets and showers. Based on a study done by the American Water Works Research Foundation, Aquacraft, and the US EPA the average person in homes built shore 1989 uses 82 gallions of water per day. Persons in homes built since 500 uses 45 gallons or without Park Persons or the person per day drops by 27% or more. That is as long as the new equipment is maintained properly.

Installing the wrong flapper or fill valve in a new toilet can erode the savings as can a bad handle or a leak.

Average daily domestic demands in commercial industrial settings range between 20 and 35 gallons per day, per employee, and savings of 25 to 35 percent of this domestic usage is readily achievable.
