About YATC



- YATC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization supported entirely by private contributions and in-kind donations. The program receives no government funding.
- Approximately 30 students attend YATC each year from September through May.
- · Prospective students are referred to the program through a variety of sources, including the local justice systems, graduates and friends.
- All students at YATC are randomly drug tested to ensure a drug-free environment.
- Merit-based scholarships are awarded to those graduates who wish to continue their technical or academic education.
- Support and follow-up services are provided for graduates and their families.
- In 1996, YATC received the Governor's Community Investment Award from the State of Florida.
- In 2000, police in Delray Beach, Florida, reported that crime fell nearly 60% in the neighborhood from which YATC had accepted six troubled kids as students.
- YATC has been used as a model for similar programs in Chicago, Illinois; Savannah, Georgia; Los Angeles, California; Newark, New Jersey; and Charlotte, North Carolina.
- More than 90% of YATC graduates are employed, continuing their education or serving in the armed forces.
- With more than 30 years in South Florida, YATC has changed the lives of more than 600 young adults.



Youth Automotive Training Center

Founded by automotive legend Jim Moran in 1984, YATC's tuition-free, nine-month training program gives disadvantaged youth a much-needed second chance to jump start their lives.

Students are referred to the non-profit school by the juvenile and adult court systems, police departments, school professionals, concerned citizens and YATC graduates. Many of these young men and women have experienced poverty, crime, abuse or addiction even before reaching their teen years. The school supports a culturally diverse population, welcoming students of any race, gender, color, nationality or ethnic origin.



Its Board of Directors and Advisory Board are composed of community-minded citizens who encourage and mentor students and graduates on their road to a successful future.

YATC is unique in that its support does not end at graduation. The school continues to provide valuable resources and opportunities to graduates and their families to help them stay on the right track.
