Callisto started with a goal to build a system that empowers survivors, rebuilding their sense of agency, prioritizes privacy, and facilitates coordinated action. Our solution, Callisto Vault, is a suite of tools designed to help survivors navigate barriers and define their own pathways toward healing and justice. Within Callisto Vault, survivors can access two tools: the Matching System and Encrypted Record Form.

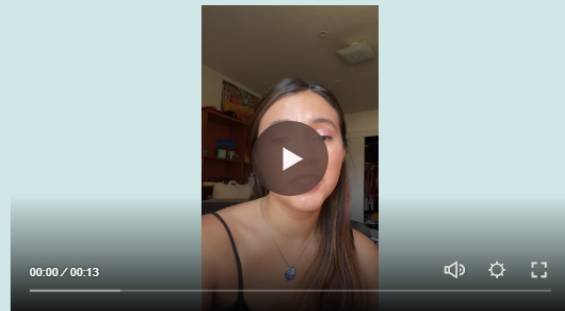


By matching survivors of the same perpetrator, we

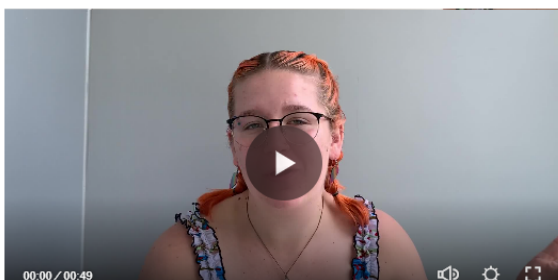

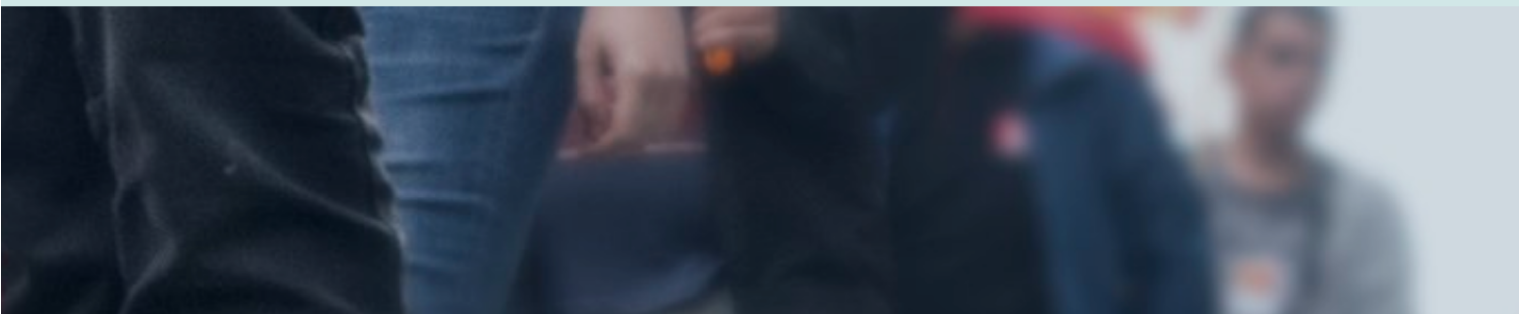
Having Callisto at Florida State opened up conversation between survivors, allies, friends of the community were looking for a safe space to talk about prevention tactics, about safety measures for



Repeat perpetrators commit 90% of sexual assaults. When a survivor enters into matching using the Callisto Vault, we can help identify repeat perpetrators across our network. This supports community safety by potentially stopping a repeat perpetrator from harming others. Additionally, survivors sometimes are better prepared to navigate the system if they have someone else who has also experienced the same thing.
