#### **Lizards For Year-Round Bass Fishing**

Plastic lizards are top lures for fishing largemouth spawning beds. Bass often attack this unwanted intruder to protect their precious eggs. Yet the soft-plastic lizard shouldn't be pegged as a spawn-only bait. Bass eat lizards yearround.

Tom Johnson, state herpetologist for the Missouri Department of Conservation, says that lizards are reptiles that normally stay away from the water. A salamander spends limited time in the water and may be confused for a lizard, but on average, bass just don't see many real live lizards. They certainly aren't on the daily menu.



So why is the plastic lizard a top bass lure? It could be the egg-protection factor no matter the season. Eat it now and it won't be there come spawn time. Or, like many bass baits, it may simply look like something good to eat that won't be hard to get down the throat – no spiny fins or sharp teeth. One thing's for sure, though, bass hate lizards and want each one


