

Hello World tutorial to help you quickly get familiarized with Magic.

☐ Get Template Code

Let's get started by building a simple interface to let users log in or log out via an email magic link experience. We've created a template with necessary html and styles on CodeSandBox.

Malkthrough



Install Magic SDK to your template by simply including a script tag after the comment line in the CodeSandBox editor. You can start by copy and pasting the code snippet below to your editor under the comment.

```
1 <!-- 1 Install Magic SDK -->
2 <script src="https://cdn.jsdelivr.net/npm/magic-sdk/dist/magic.js"></script>
```

See other ways to install Magic SDK such as using yarn or npm.



Initialize Magic Instance

You can initialize a Magic instance with your Publishable API Key with the following code. Copy and paste this code snippet below to your editor under the comment.

```
1 /* 2 Initialize Magic Instance */
2 const magic = new Magic("YOUR_TEST_PUBLISHABLE_API_KEY");
```

You need to sign up or log in to the Magic Dashboard to view your API keys. Once you are logged in, you can then update the 'YOUR_TEST_PUBLISHABLE_API_KEY' string to your actual test *publishable* API key, which looks something like pk_test_**********.



Implement Render Function

Next, to complete the setup, let's write the logic on what the Hello World app should display when (1) users are not logged in, and when (2) users are logged in. Copy and paste this code snippet below to your editor under the comment.

Implement Login Handler

Now the real fun begins! Check out how you can implement user login with a single line of code, without needing to write any backend code! Copy and paste this code snippet below to your editor under the comment.

Implement Logout Handler

To wrap it all up, it's super easy to implement user logout as well. Copy and paste this code snippet below to your editor under the comment.
