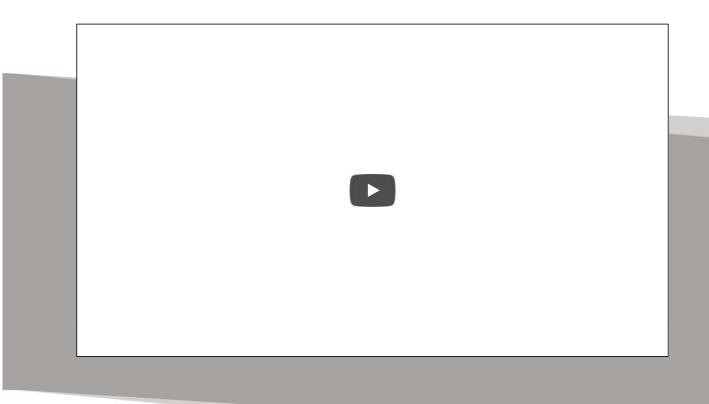
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The Samaritan Rebrand

Over the last several months, we've been thinking a lot about our values and about the images we use to represent our company. And so we got to thinking about our namesake and his trusty sidekick.

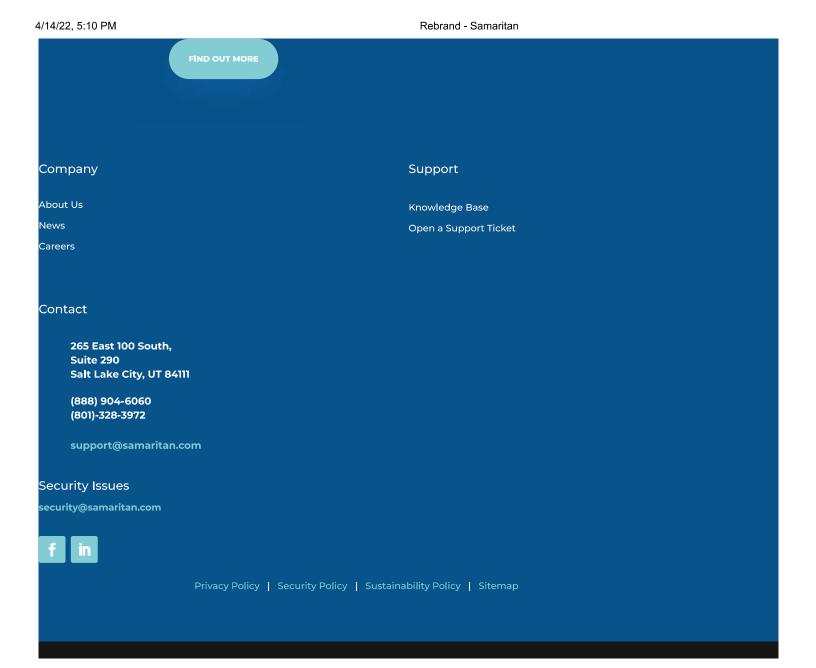
With that in mind, we'd like to introduce you to Samaritan's new logo:
