Coach Greg has had a passion for baseball his whole life. During his high school tenure, he helped lead his team to win the state championship and was named the 2001 Gatorade State Player of the Year for Maine and the 2001 John Winkin Maine State Player of the Year.

Coach Greg went on to play at the University of Maine on a baseball scholarship. During his time there he helped bring his team to two NCAA World Series regionals.

Greg's relentless dedication, and hard work landed him with the Atlanta Braves where he played professionally for six years. He was honored with the Atlanta Braves Bill Lucas Award in 2009.

Passionate about helping kids learn the fundamentals of baseball, and teaching his love of the game, Coach Greg has committed the last 13 years as a private baseball instructor and coach. In 2018 he founded The Mayhem Nation travel baseball organization. And most recently, in 2022 he was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame for the state of Maine. In 2022, he also accepted the position as Head Baseball Coach for Braden River High School in Bradenton, FL.

Stephen started his playing career locally at Twin Lakes Little League in Sarasota, followed by Riverview High School from which he was recruited to play at the University Tampa.
