lightship ☆ n. a ship moored in a place dangerous or important to navigation and bearing a light or lights and foghorns, sirens, etc. by which ships are warned or guided

light show ☆ a display of moving, changing patterns of colored light, images, etc. projected as in a darkened auditorium, often as an accompaniment to rock music

lightsome ☆ adj. [[ME lihtsum: see light2 & -some1]] 1 nimble, buoyant, graceful, or lively2 lighthearted; cheerful or merry3 not serious; frivolous

lightsome ☆ adj. [[ME lyghtesum: see light1 & -some1]] [Archaic] 1 giving light; luminous2 well-lighted; bright
