Definition of treatment

la: the act or manner or an instance of <u>treating</u> someone or something: <u>handling</u>, <u>usage</u> the star requires careful treatment

b: the techniques or actions customarily applied in a specified situation

2a: a substance or technique used in treating

b: an experimental condition






