TO THE COMMISSIONER OF PATENTS AND TRADEMARKS:

The Applicant for trademark serial number 86/335,206 respectfully requests that the Commissioner enter the following response into the record

The Examining Attorney has refused registration of Applicant's mark based on a finding of likelihood of confusion as to the similarity of Applicant's VAPOR mark and the VAPOR APPAREL mark in cited registration 3,,554,188 (hereinafter the "Cited Registration"). Applicant respectfully submits that the likelihood of confusion is obviated by the difference in commercial appearance of the marks, the narrow scope of protection afforded to the Cited Registration and the separate channels of trade in which Applicant provides its goods.

Commercial Appearance

The overall commercial impression generated by the Applicants mark and the cited registration are distinct. While the Examiner refers to the Cited Registration as a word mark, the Cited Registration is in fact a color limited design mark (shown below). As a design mark, the overall commercial impression of the mark must include not only the word portions, but the design portions as well.



The Applicants mark is a word mark that is free of design elements and omits the term apparel. As such the commercial impression generated between the Applicants mark and the Cited Registration is quite distinct.

Channels of Trade

The channels of trade in which Applicant and Registrant provide their goods do not overlap, thus decreasing the likelihood of confusion among consumers. Applicant markets and sells its products and services via its own website and it thrift store outlets. Applicant does not sell its goods in retail establishments, such as Dick's Sporting Goods, or any other retail venue where clothing is sold. Further, Applicant's individual members promote Applicant's goods. It follows that when consumers view Applicant's mark through its infomercials, website, and members they do not see any third party marks. There is never any retail comparison. Consumers can never see the Applicant's mark and the mark in the Cited Registration together.


In contrast, the owner of the Cited Registration sells its apparel through limited distributors in the US (see Exhibit A taken from the Vapor Apparel website) and through through various internet portals (see exhibit B). Furthermore, the goods marketed under the cited registration are marketed for the purpose of sublimation printing. Thus, Applicant's and Registrant's consumers never see the respective marks side-by-side.


Based on the foregoing, Applicant submits that its channels of trade are completely distinct from those used by Registrant, which significantly decreases any likelihood of confusion between Applicant's and Registrant's marks.

The Coexistence of the Cited Registration with multiple registrations for marks containing the term VAPOR demonstrates the narrow scope of protection afforded to the Cited Registration. Just as the Cited Registration can co-exist with multiple registrations for marks containing the term VAPOR in IC 025 without a likelihood of confusion, Applicants mark should also be able to co-exist.
