AMENDMENT

Sir:

In response to the Office Action of January 27, 2016, it is requested that the following changes be made.

In the color claim for the mark:

Please delete the original claim and substitute therefor the following:

Color claim: "The colors orange, green, blue, purple, pink, red, yellow  
and white are claimed as a feature of the mark."

In the description of the mark:

Please delete the original description and substitute therefor the following:

Mark description: "The mark consists of the stylized wording "LOCUS", with the letter "O" in "LOCUS" represented by a stylized image of the inside of an orange half; with the orange having skin shades of orange, two partial green leaves extending from the edge of the orange, white pith around and between the segments, yellow highlighting on the outer edge of the pith, and segments in shades of yellow, shades of green, shades of blue, shades of purple, shades of pink, shades of red, and shades of orange; with the letters "L" and "CUS" in "LOCUS" appearing in shades of orange."

#### REMARKS

Careful consideration has been given to the Office Action of January 27, 2016 and it is requested that the application as amended be re-examined and promptly published.

Applicant notes the Examining Attorney's objection to the drawing and the requirement for a new drawing. There is submitted herewith a new drawing which does not contain any of the extraneous matter noted by the Examining Attorney.

Applicant notes the objection of the Examining Attorney to both the color claim and mark description. The color claim suggested by the Examining Attorney has been adopted in its entirety. With respect to the description of the mark, it too has been adopted except for the language "and with the shades of colors in the mark features giving the appearance of horizontal stripes" because the apparent horizontal stripes are due to the same problems that caused defects in the original drawings. The apparent horizontal stripes are not part of the description as shown in the newly submitted drawing.

Applicant notes that the Examining Attorney's search of the Office records has failed to reveal any conflicting marks that would bar registration under Section 2(d).
