APPLICANT'S RESPONSE TO OFFICE ACTION

The following is the response of Applicant, Blaze Beverage, LLC by Counsel, to the above referenced Office Action dated October 23, 2018.

LIKELIHOOD OF CONFUSION REFUSAL

The Examining Attorney has refused registration of the proposed ACCENTS mark pursuant to Trademark Act Section 2(d), 15 U.S.C. § 1052(d), on the ground that the mark is likely to be confused with Registration No. 2,845,376 for ASCENT. *See* Table 1, below for a comparison of the marks and the goods/services identified by each:

The USPTO uses the *du Pont* factors to determine if a likelihood of confusion exists between two trademarks. *In re E.I. du Pont de Nemours & Co.*, 476 F.2d 1357, 177 USPQ 563 (CCPA 1973). Although the issue of likelihood of confusion typically revolves around the

similarity and dissimilarity of the marks and the relatedness of the goods or services, "there is no mathematical test for determining likelihood of confusion and each case must be decided on its own merits." TMEP § 1207.01 (citing *du Pont* 476 F.2d at 1361, 177 USPQ at 567). Similarity of the marks in one respect – sight, sound, or meaning – will not automatically result in a determination that confusion is likely even if the goods are identical or closely related; rather, taking into account all of the relevant facts of a particular case, similarity as to one factor alone *may* be sufficient to support a holding that the marks are confusingly similar. *See In re Thor Tech, Inc.*, 90 USPQ2d 1634, 1635 (TTAB 2009); *In re White Swan Ltd.*, 8 USPQ2d 1534, 1535 (TTAB 1988). *Id.*

Here, there is no possibility that a likelihood of confusion between Applicant's ACCENTS mark and the cited registration for the ASCENT mark for at least the following reasons relating to specific *du Pont* factors:

- (1) The terms comprising each mark are both common and well-known in the English language;
- (2) The terms comprising each mark are visually and phonetically distinct; and
- (3) The terms comprising each mark have entirely unrelated meanings, which are well-understood by American consumers.

(1) The terms comprising each mark are both common and well-known in the English language.

Applicant's mark is ACCENTS, which is the plural form of ACCENT. According to the website https://www.english-corpora.org/coca/ the "ACCENT" term has a frequency of 7755 out of 560 million words in the Corpus of Contemporary American English. (See attached Exhibit A) The use of this term is familiar in sentences such as the following.

- He spoke in his British accent, which always sounded distinctly upper-crust...
- I told you that your **accent** comes out when you're riled up.
- It was a woman's voice with a noticeable Spanish accent.
- Most of the children of New Orleans spoke with Southern **accents**, but his was closer to French.

- The agua **accents** and plastic slipcovers she adds to her bleak dressing room.

Similarly, the "ASCENT" term, which is a conjugation of the "ASCEND" term has a frequency of 1860 in the Corpus of Contemporary American English, making it not quite as common as the "ACCENT" terms, but not at all uncommon. (*See attached Exhibit B*) The use of this term is familiar in sentences such as the following.

- But the **ascent** of Jokic made Nurkic expendable.
- But everything changed on Denali, a week into their **ascent** of the tallest peak in North America.
- Donald Trump's ascent to the presidency will go down as one of the...

In sum, both "ACCENTS" and "ASCENT" are commonly used terms in the English language and the average consumer would be familiar with each and have no problem distinguishing between them. Additionally, evidence that consumers are not confused by the use of these terms or very similar terms to identify related goods can be seen in the following table.

(2) The terms comprising each mark are visually and phonetically distinct.

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, the root of Applicant's "ACCENTS" term is pronounced as follows: ('ak-sent) (See attached Exhibit C) The AK- prefix is accented in the in the "ACCENTS" term, which is the opposite of the "ASCENT" term wherein the "-SCENT" suffix is accented. According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, Applicant's "ASCENT" mark is pronounced as follows: (ə-'sent) (See attached Exhibit D) The Examiner's claim that, "[t]he marks in question could clearly be pronounced the same...," which underlies this entire office action, is clearly erroneous as there is no plausible reading of both terms that would result in the same pronunciation of each.

(3) The terms comprising each mark have entirely unrelated meanings, which are well-understood by American consumers.

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, Applicant's "ACCENTS" term can be a noun or a verb and has many meanings including the following (*See attached Exhibit C*):

- An effort in speech to stress one syllable over adjacent syllables (noun);
- A distinctive manner of expression (noun);
- To give special attention of prominence to (something) (verb); or
- To make (something) more emphatic, noticeable, or distinct (verb).

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, Applicant's "ASCENT" term is a noun having the following meanings (*See attached Exhibit D*):

- The act of rising or moving upward; or
- An advance in social status or reputation; or
- A going back in time or upward in order of genealogical succession.

Clearly, "ACCENTS" and "ASCENT" have wholly unrelated meanings which also weigh against a finding that a likelihood of confusion exists in this case. Under *du Pont*, trademarks are compared for similarity or dissimilarity in their entireties as to appearance, sound, commutation and overall commercial impression. *du Pont* 476 F.2d at 1361. "Marks tend to be perceived in their entireties, and all components thereof must be given appropriate weight." *In re Hearst*

Corporation, 982 F.2d 493, 494 (Fed. Cir. 1992) (citing Opryland USA, Inc. v. Great American Music Show, Inc., 9970 F.2d 847, 23 USPQ2d 1471 (Fed. Cir. 1992). Even where marks share a common portion, confusion is unlikely if they create a different commercial impression. See Long John Distilleries, Ltd. v. Sazerac, 426 F.2d 1406, 166 USPQ 30 (CCPA 1970).

In this case, the Examining Attorney appears to have transposed some of the letters comprising the ASCENT mark ("ACSENT" rather than "ASCENT"), which could make the transposed term phonetically equivalent to the Applicant's mark. However, the mark must be examined as it truly exists and not based upon a misreading of it and "ASCENT" can never be pronounced as ('ak-, sent).

CONCLUSION

In sum, "ACCENT" and ASCENT" are both common and well-known in the English language; each mark is visually and phonetically distinct from the other; and the terms comprising each mark have entirely unrelated meanings, which are well-understood by American consumers. Therefore, Applicant respectfully requests that the statutory refusal be withdrawn, and the application permitted to proceed to publication.
