Rehabilitation treatment program consisted of the following skilled interventions:

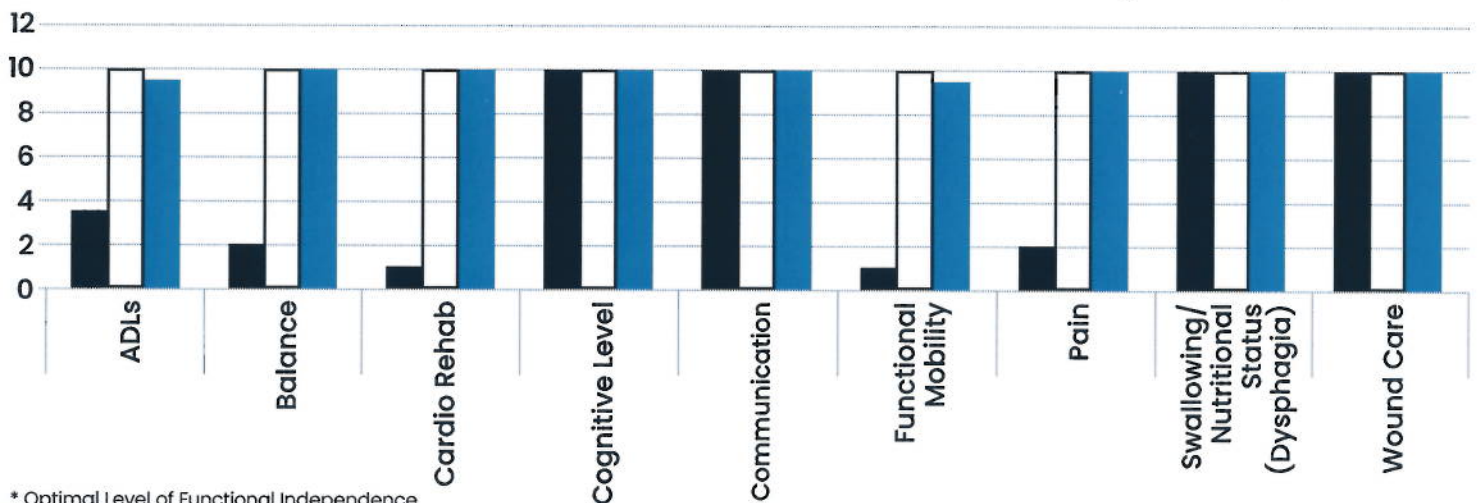
OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY: 5x/week x 14 weeks

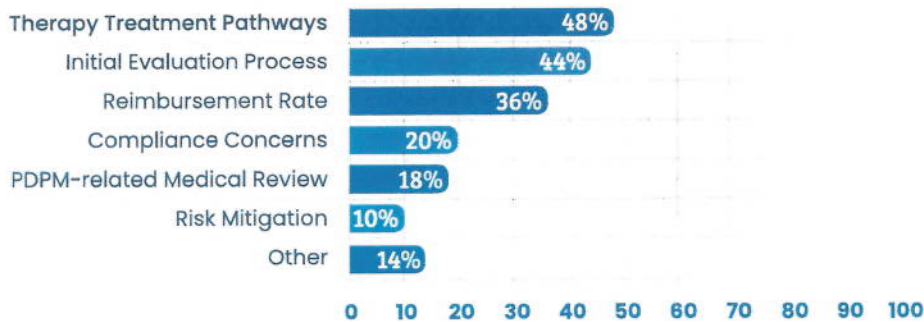
What are SNF Top PDPM Priorities?

Reliant Survey Says Therapy Pathways and Evaluation

In a survey made up of both inhouse and outsource therapy model SNF operators, respondents cited therapy treatment pathways and the admission evaluation process as their top two priorities preparing for PDPM this fall. Forty-eight percent of respondents cited therapy treatment pathways as their first or second priority, and 44 percent ranked the initial evaluation process the same level of priority.

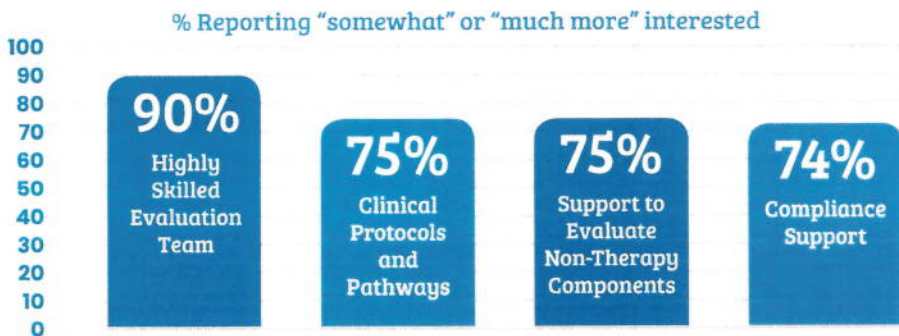
