body *noun* (PHYSICAL CREATURE)



[C]

the whole physical structure that is a person or animal:

Sometimes body can refer to the main, physical part of a person or animal but not include the head, or not include the head and the arms and legs.

A body is also a dead person:

- *Police found the man's body in the next room.*

body *noun* (GROUP OF PEOPLE)

- *There is a growing body of evidence to support their innocence.*
