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## body noun (PHYSICAL CREATURE)

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[C]

**the whole physical structure that is a person or animal:**

- *A good diet and plenty of exercise will help you keep your body healthy.*

**Sometimes body can refer to the main, physical part of a person or animal but not include the head, or not include the head and the arms and legs.**

**A body is also a dead person:**

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**body noun (GROUP OF PEOPLE)**

**a group of people who have joined together for a particular reason:**

- *Congress is a legislative body created to consider and pass laws.*

**an amount of something:**

- *There is a growing body of evidence to support their innocence.*

### **Definition of *fuel* (Entry 1 of 2)**

- 1 a : a material used to produce heat or power by burning
- b : nutritive material
- c : a material from which atomic energy can be liberated especially in a reactor
- 2 : a source of sustenance or incentive : REINFORCEMENT
