**RESPONSE TO OFFICE ACTION**

Dear Examining Attorney Jesse Nelman:

This letter is in response and in opposition to the Office Action dated 6/12/19, regarding the search of the Office Records and the required Responses to Refusal of Application for Trademark Serial Number 88371399, a stylized depiction of "FL," filed on 04/04/19. In that letter the USPTO (hereafter, “the Office”) indicated refusal of the application under three specific objections. First, a requirement of amendment to correct an “indefinite and overly broad identification of services.” Second, a clarification regarding the number of classes sought for the mark. Third, amendment of the mark description to remove interpretive elements. Please find my modifications below.

**REMARKS**

**1. INDEFINITE AND OVERLY BROAD IDENTIFICATION OF SERVICES**

The descriptions suggested are acceptable, specifically:

Class 39– “International and domestic freight forwarding services, the shipping of goods, warehousing services, transportation of goods.”

Class 42— Computer software development in the field of international and domestic freight forwarding providing real-time logistics; to include shipping, warehousing, transportation, insurance, logistics consulting, and logistics strategy.

**2. CLARIFICATION REQUIRED REGARDING THE NUMBER OF CLASSES FOR WHICH REGISTRATION IS SOUGHT**

The applicant wishes to seek registration under classes 039 and 042 as described above. The applicant paid for two classes at the initial submission and will remain having selected two classes.

**3. MARK DESCRIPTION AMENDMENT REQUIRED**

Per the Examining Attorney’s direction, Applicant elects use the suggested description: “The mark consists of a stylized incomplete triangle composed of the letters “F” and “L.”
