- 2 usually *sollar* or *sol-ler* \ˈsā-lər : a platform in a Cornish mine shaft and especially between a series of ladders : a longitudinal partition forming an air passage between itself and the roof in a mine working

Origin of SOLAR

Middle English *soler*, *solar*, from Old English *soler*, *solar*, akin to Middle Dutch *solre* loft, flat roof, Middle Low German *solder*, Old High German *solāri* loft; all from a prehistoric West Germanic word borrowed from Latin *solarium* part of a house exposed to the sun — more at SOLARIUM
