Definition of *plate*

(Entry 1 of 2)

la: a smooth flat thin piece of material

b(1): forged, rolled, or cast metal in sheets usually thicker than $\frac{1}{4}$ inch (6 millimeters)

(2): a very thin layer of metal deposited on a surface of base metal by plating

c: one of the broad metal pieces used in armor also: armor of such plates

d(1): a thin relatively flat anatomical part (such as a lamina of bone) of an animal body especially: scute






