Higdon aims to leave mark

For his senior year at the University of Michigan, Karan Higdon wants to accomplish something big. Last season the former Riverview High **star** ran for a team-high 994 yards - twice rushing for 200 in a game - scored 11 touchdowns and was named the Wolverines'Offensive **Player** of the Year.

Productive, right Even big, by most standards.

Just not Higdon's.

"I loved it, but I wasn't shocked or surprised," he said. "This year I want to do something that's going to shock myself. That's pretty hard to do, but I want to make it happen."

Higdon has always set lofty goals, and he's raising the bar for his final "Go Blue" go-round. **Who**'s Michigan's single-season © 2020 Corsearch www.corsearch.com

rushing leader That would be Tim Biakabutuka, who gained 1,818 yards in 1995.

A long way to the top. But Higdon believes he's capable of getting there.

"This year is different," he said. "I'm walking in the door as the starting running back. Last year I didn't

become the starter until game 5 or 6. So within 6, 7 games I accumulated close to 1,000 yards. It's crazy.

"If I stay healthy this year, God willing, I expect to have a big year. One that will definitely leave a legacy at the University of Michigan."

Before Higdon undertakes the challenge, area **football players** will get the chance to wish him luck, while bettering their own game.

The second annual **Who Next Football** Camp is set for Feb. 17-18 at the Larry Thoennissen Field on City Center Boulevard in North Port. The camp's first day is for **players** in grades K-8 and will focus on position training and technical development.

Day 2 will attract national recruiting services such as Scout.com and 247Sports, which will create recruiting profiles of each of the participants. It's for **players** in grades 9-12 and will feature many of the same drills demanded of collegians at the NFL Combine.

Last year representatives attended from Michigan and Boise State. Higdon said two **players** got calls from Michigan immediately following the camp. Ex- **players** from the Canadian **Football** League and Arena League helped out.

"We had a great turnout," Higdon said. "We're expecting a much bigger turnout this year. Now everybody knows what it's about. They saw how organized it was and we got a lot of great feedback from it."

The camp will run from 2 to 4 p.m. each day and costs \$35 per day. Those interested in participating can register and pay at www.whonextwarriors.com.

After weighing the pros and cons, Higdon decided to return to Michigan for his senior season. "I want to be in a better position for next year's draft."

The extra year also will allow him to earn his master's in social work. Higdon said he's on course to receive his undergraduate degree in business, with a focus on marketing and sales, in April or May.

After what he hopes is a lengthy pro career, Higdon plans to return to school to continue work on becoming an anesthesiologist. He interned last year, and the sight of Higdon in scrubs was memorable.

"Compared to the other nurses, it was hilarious," he said.

As part of his internship, Higdon got to see various surgeries.

"It's very similar to **football**," he said. "Just the discipline and the environment. You walk in and there's a huddle. They huddle up and everyone knows their assignment. Every guy and girl has their job and they have to fulfill their job. And the surgeon is like the quarterback. He's calling the shots and you're doing your part."

Come the fall, Karan Higdon will do his part for the Michigan football team. His last chance to leave a legacy tinted blue.

Scullers send 8 to World Indoor

The Sarasota Scullers sometime get lost amid the shadow cast by the Sarasota Crew. But the oldest rowing program in Sarasota County will be well represented at the first World Rowing Indoor Championships, set for Feb. 17-18 in Alexandria, Virginia.

The Scullers will send seven student- **athletes** and one coach/master to the event being staged by World Rowing, the same organization behind last year's World Rowing Championships in Sarasota.

The seven are Kaden Bowels (Sarasota High), TJ Cochran (Venice), Shelby Ernst (Fort Myers), Savannah Stewart (Riverview), Emily Naidel (Pine View School), Patrick Watson (Out-of-Door Academy) and Katie Beiler (Riverview). Head coach Laura Corbett-Brown will compete in the masters'category.

The Scullers also will be moving into a 2,000-square-foot indoor training facility and clubhouse. Located in Osprey, the facility will be one of the largest training centers in the south devoted to rowing.

The facility will have sufficient room for indoor rowing machines, new fitness equipment and offices. Scullers president Seth Koplin said he wants the center "to be a second home for our kids."

Losing a'unique voice'

Louisville lost a'true force'when Robert Leachman was killed, family and friends say

Robert Leachman wasn't one to bite his tongue.

He wouldn't shy away, no matter whether it was calling out perceived injustices or disagreeing over who was next in a pickup **basketball** game, his mother and others say.

"He's not gonna let nobody run over him or dictate nothing in his life," said Jamie Denton, his mom. "He's a very upfront spoken person ... in his own unique way."

His voice, some say, could have been a "true force" for young people; potential he showed in a viral video he took of a police officer interaction that sparked an internal Louisville Metro Police investigation in 2016.

Instead, he died at age 20.

Leachman was killed by multiple gunshot wounds in the Parkway Place Apartments off Brashear Drive on Aug. 2. Family

members and others speculate his death stemmed from an argument over a basketball game.

Police declined to confirm the theory or go into specifics, but acknowledged that "some type of altercation took place" that led to the shooting, spokesman Dwight Mitchell said. They have arrested a suspect in connection with the shooting.

Leachman's death is one of 78 criminal homicides investigated by LMPD so far in 2017.

Denton, Leachman's mother, says he wanted in on the next **basketball** game at Park Hill Community Center and an argument ensued because others thought he wasn't from that neighborhood.

In a text Leachman sent July 24 to Denton, he warns her of that altercation: "I just got into it with these b**ches from up east at the gym I'm good at home now but (I don't know) what they on just giving u a heads up," the text from "Litt Rob" reads.

Less than two weeks later, he was dead.

Denton dreams about the day Leachman died every night, wishing she could be there or that he could have reached out to her the day he died.

"These children is nothing like how when I came up," Denton said. "We could go wherever. Wasn't like we have to watch where we go, where we can't go. It's a lot more children out here that's fighting with territorial stuff. ... It's so hurtful. Hurt, hurt, hurt."

In 2016, an unrelated incident on a different **basketball** court, captured on video, gives a glimpse into Leachman's life. The footage shows LMPD officers approach a group of **basketball players** on the court.

"We out here playin' **basketball**, they just walked up on us, they don't even know us," Leachman narrates. "... What'd we do, sir"

The officer's response can't be heard. One later appears to go through a pile of clothes left on the side of the **basketball** court at Victory Park, as **players** look on.

"Sir, I got you on camera, sir, please, I know my rights. I know my rights. Y'all are harassing us, sir, we are playing basketball, sir. Can we play basketball " Leachman continues.

The officers aren't identified in the video but were named in media reports. One of them, Officer Beau Gadegaard, was involved in the shooting of Darnell Wicker. He was exonerated by the Commonwealth's attorney and, earlier this month, suspended by LMPD for not properly using his body camera in his interaction with Wicker.

Leachman's video, along with a petition drafted by members of the California neighborhood, was the subject of an internal investigation launched in 2016. LMPD says the investigation is ongoing and would not comment.

Leachman also filed a lawsuit in 2016 against Gadegaard in response to the incident, alleging Gadegaard's conduct was racially biased and discriminatory. His family plans to move forward with the suit, despite his death.

The Louisville attorney who represented Leachman, Sam Aguiar, said the case was more about principle and less about the money. In particular, Gadegaard moves toward the camera in a somewhat aggressive manner, calling Leachman "homeboy" and asking if he has a problem.

"The sense I got from Robert is that he did want to stand up against bullies. He didn't have a tolerance for that kind of behavior," Aguiar said. "He was willing to be a voice, to say, listen, we're not going to tolerate this. He had leadership qualities and some potential."

In addition to the civil recourse, Leachman spoke out publicly on the issue and attended a conference with police chiefs.

"He felt like he was the young person on an island by himself, to want to see the hood change, but he was savvy and smart

enough to understand that change wasn't easy and he couldn't overdo it with them," Christopher 2X, a well-known activist and peace and justice advocate in Louisville, said. "He was always plotting to get them to a better place."

Leachman planned to start nursing school Aug. 14, which his mother said he'd been talking about since he was 13 years old. He died on his grandmother's birthday, 12 days before his school start date.

The suspect in Leachman's death, Deandre Williams, 20, was indicted last week on a murder charge and is next due in court Sept. 8.

A judge initially granted Williams home incarceration, citing scant detail in his arrest report. That move prompted outcry from LMPD Chief Steve Conrad, who wrote on Facebook that the decision made them "astonished and incredibly disappointed."

Williams later returned to jail after his indictment by a grand jury.

Jeff Cooke, a spokesman for the commonwealth's attorney's office, did not provide specific details on the case, but noted that prosecutors will begin to file evidence before his September pretrial conference.

Christopher 2X and Derrick Miller, founder of the **Who**'s **Next basketball** program and a former **basketball** coach of Leachman's, plan to host an event in his memory in October.

"We're trying to use this event to touch young lives and let them know that Rob wasn't forgotten," Miller said. "Even though some people might see him in another light, this is how we see Rob. Whenever he would come around, he'd talk with the kids, play with them. He was good to them."

For 2X, Leachman's death means the loss of a "unique voice."

"He struggled, but he didn't hide from the struggle. ... In time, if he was cultivated in the right direction - and I mean him doing self-cultivation - he could've been a force in this city," 2X said. "He could've been a true force."

Violent crime up to start year

\$625K in grants planned to help turn the tide

More people have been murdered in the first seven weeks of the year in Louisville than the same period in 2016, a year in which the city set a record for homicides.

Louisville Metro Police's weekly crime report, obtained by the Courier-Journal, shows there have been 17 homicides this year as of Feb. 17, a 30 percent increase from the 13 committed in the same period last year. There also have been 46 shootings, representing a 7 percent increase from 43 a year earlier.

At this pace, Louisville would record more than 150 homicides, crushing last year's record of 124, which includes killings investigated by metro police as well as other agencies. There would be almost 540 shootings this year at that pace, compared to last year's 504.

Police spokesman Dwight Mitchell on Tuesday morning called the crime report a "preliminary document" but later confirmed the numbers.

The data show violent crime may be worsening among teens and young adults. So far this year, more than a third of the city's 17 homicide victims and half of the 46 shooting victims have been between the ages of 16 and 25.

Besides funding more police officers to combat the surge, the city has partnered with nonprofit groups to work with teens and young adults in five key neighborhoods: Russell, Parkland, California, Shawnee and Newburg.

To fund that effort, the Metro Council appropriated about \$625,000 in December to Mayor Greg Fischer's Safe & Healthy Neighborhoods office. Of that amount, the office doled out \$143,000 to nearly two-dozen organizations to help reduce violence.

Roughly 50 groups sent applications seeking funding with grants ranging from \$5,700 to \$10,000 being awarded to 19 groups. Among the notable recipients were groups like the Allan Houston Foundation, 100 Black Men, YMCA Safe Place and Stand Up Sunday, an offshoot of the local Black Lives Matter movement.

Rashaad Abdur-Rahman, director of Safe & Healthy Neighborhoods, said the rest of the money is being spent on collaboration efforts with groups such as the Louisville Urban League and No More Red Dots campaign. It also is going toward gun safety education and establishing a team of interrupters - activists, former gang members and ex-drug dealers - to work the streets and intervene before conflicts escalate into violence.

"You cannot deny these are investments that haven't been there before," he said. "... I don't think we can say the \$625,000 is going to be the amount that's going to turn the tide but it's part of a long-term investment that's promising."

Fallen will remain in the USHL office for the next few months to help with the transition of duties.

"I believe strongly in the USHL, its purpose and fully expect it to continue to be regarded as one of the world's top developmental leagues," Fallen said in a statement released by the league. "Individuals and organizations evolve and change. I'm leaving on good terms and it's time to seek new challenges and opportunities."

Fallen, a big proponent of the league after watching his son Tommy parlay a stint in Cedar Rapids into a successful playing career at Yale, joined the USHL in 2014. He helped develop the # WhosNext campaign, which spotlighted USHL stars aiming for collegiate and professional careers.

Fallen also promoted the "Make the Educated Decision" campaign and "The Path" marketing campaign. Both endeavors illustrated how the USHL can lead to opportunities in college and professional hockey.

According to the USHL, Fallen's efforts significantly increased media exposures. Total measured media impressions from traditional outlets jumped from 8.7 million in 2014 to 16.4 million in 2016, as well as social media total followings from 29,000 to over 100,000 fans to date.

"Bob's passion for the league, marketing expertise, relationships within the North American hockey community, and his sincere, tireless efforts contributed significantly to the growth of the USHL brand," Brad Kwong, the managing partner of the

Dubuque Fighting Saints and a former USHL chairman said in a statement released by the USHL.

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
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
