




Dear Friend,

Several years ago, we worked to find a way to allow UTMB employees working across the state to give to agencies and causes in the communities where they live and work. With three campuses, a large network of Correctional Managed Care sites, 30+ clinics in the Regional Maternal and Child Health Program, plus many other community clinics throughout the region, the effort proved popular and our hope is that it will once again have a significant positive impact in many new places.

How it Works

The State Employee Charitable Campaign divides the state into campaign areas. Galveston Island is one campaign area. The rest of Galveston County and Greater Houston are another area. Seventeen campaign regions blanket Texas in total.

The majority of charities that are part of the annual campaign are called "statewide charities." They are statewide or national in scope, and are shared in common by all the regions. However, in addition to these shared agencies, each of the individual areas has a group of local charities that are part of the campaign for

that specific region. For example, the local charities in the Galveston campaign have included choices as varied as the Rosenberg Library, the ADA Women's Center, and the Galveston Island Humane Society. Other regions have similar choices that typically serve needs within a specific community.

Your gifts are welcome wherever you choose to direct them. With a few extra--but simple--steps, you can give to any SECC local charity in the state. Here's how:

Step 1:

Select <u>your region (http://www.secctexas.org/map.php)</u> and visit its directory to see local agency choices, all linked below. The local charitable organizations are listed starting on page 21 of the 2019 campaign directories.
