

The goal of the Masters in Governance program is to provide school trustees and superintendents with the knowledge and skills to function effectively as governance teams.

#### **PROGRAM CONTENT**

The Masters in Governance is a groundbreaking continuing education program that recognizes the necessity for the board and superintendent to work closely toward a common goal.
