Please note that the workshop will begin at 9:00 AM on Saturday. Fellows must ensure that they arrive before the 9:00 AM Saturday workshop start. If you are traveling a long distance, we advise that you plan to arrive the night before. The workshop ends on Sunday at 2:00 PM. Accommodations are not provided.

Program Requirements

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Are alumni from the AMCLI National and Regional training programs
- Have a project that you are planning or a strategy that you want to apply to a project that you are working on
- Hold a position within a non-profit organization, government, network, media, or faith institution (paid/unpaid)
- Are committed to advancing their community rather than simply advancing their personal platform
- Pay a **non-refundable workshop fee of \$295*** (credit card ONLY). Partial scholarships are provided on a need basis.

*Accepted applicants are required to pay a **non-refundable \$295 workshop fee** to secure their place in the workshop. Credit card only. Please note that the workshop fee is NOT considered a tuition payment to the University of Southern California for tax purposes.

The average cost for a **week-long strategy workshop/training** is to \$7,000 per person. Through the generous support of our funders, AMCLI is able to underwrite this workshop at a drastically reduced cost. AMCLI will cover the cost for training, meals, and materials during the workshop.
