






I Don't Have My ST*FF Together. Can I Still Come?

Everyone from all walks of life is welcome here, regardless of where you are in your spiritual journey, regardless of what you believe. When you come on Saturday nights, you'll see business executives and folk between jobs, a young professional and a young adult in treatment. We're cool if you've been in the back of a cop car or you drive a cop car. Whether you're part of a family, struggling to raise teenagers or just out of a tough relationship—we've got a seat for you.

We believe a different kind of community forms when we set aside what can easily separate us, things like being Republican, Democrat, a Texan or die-hard Cowboy fan, two days sober or never touched a drink, documented or undocumented, introverted or never met a stranger, worn out or energized. We are a part of the United Methodist tradition which means we believe the grace of God is available to all, offers forgiveness and calls us to a life of justice and mercy.



What's The Worship Service Like?

Saturday night at Mercy Street is filled with live music, authentic stories and practical messages set in a casual come as you are environment. We extend a gift of Christian community to everyone, no matter what faith, religion, addiction, or experience.

More specifically

We're paper free so there's no bulletin, but here's what you can expect: homemade cookies

and coffee, sing a few songs, short prayer/meditation, and open-mic celebrations for what God is doing in our city. Then we read from the Bible, usually some fascinating story of the unholy, uncertain yet hope-filled people guided by a God known for radical grace and love, and our pastor gives a 25 minute message. Aftewards, we have 12-step meetings, a mental health peer support group and small groups. The first Saturday of the month we celebrate Holy Communion—all are welcome to the table. The second Saturday of the month we go to dinner at Buffalo Grille (Voss & Woodway) after the service.

We enjoy conversation and connection before and after each service. We start the service right at 5:30PM so come a little early to hang out, enjoy homemade cookies and coffee, and grab a seat before 5:30PM.

What About My Kids?

We love kids and have a special program designed just for them. Come by our Kidz Table when you walk in to sign in your children and meet the volunteer. Nursery is 3 months (or when baby is holding her head up) – Kindergarten. These young ones can be checked-in when you get here and you can pick them up again once the service or your meeting is over. Children 1st - 5th grade stay with their parents in the main service during the music andare then released to the kids program where they explore God's word with kid-friendly worship and lessons. Crafts, games, interactive songs, and skits mixed with a little imagination and a lot of fun are also on the agenda. Our leaders love kids and we value the privilege of teaching and encouraging them. We also have a strong youth program. Teenagers worship with their parents in the main service and then head to the game room after announcements for a time of socializing and playing games followed by dinner and time to talk deeper about the Bible. Mercy Street Students is a great place for students to make life long friends and start to learn more about their own faith.







Where Is It?

NOTE: It's a fancy zip code with a laid-back atmosphere. We're located in the Fellowship Hall of <u>Chapelwood United Methodist Church at 11140 Greenbay, Houston, TX 77024</u>. 






Our mission is "Mercy Street creates a safe harbor of hope and transformation, so all may experience the radical grace of God!"

Our community includes people diverse in our experiences and backgrounds but common in our desire to seek a connection to God. Whether you have faith, struggle with your faith or have lost your faith, Mercy Street opens its doors to people who desire a place to develop their spiritual journey in community, not in isolation. A lot of us are involved in recovery either from bad church experiences or addictions of "more."

We believe Jesus is the Son of God and restorer of all our hurts, pain and brokenness. Yet sometimes the followers of Jesus become the barrier to the person Jesus. So if we could tell you one important thing about our community; it is that we are all works in progress. We desire to be on a common path towards loving God and one another with our whole heart. In short, this is a messy community where we will sometimes disappoint one another. The hope is that we don't run from community, instead we lean-in and trust that giving ourselves towards love in Christ really can make a difference in our lives and our relationships.

Wherever you are spiritually, we will support and love you in your journey. At Mercy Street words such as transformed, revived, restored and connected have deep roots and can be seen in the lives of real people. Some people have said when you come to a small group or the Saturday night worship, chances are you are talking to a miracle—a life restored from brokenness and moving towards greater transformation.







WHO WE ARE:

Everyone from all walks of life is welcome at Mercy Street. At our Saturday night worship service, you'll find someone from Penn State and the State Penn. We are business executives and folks between jobs. People in treatment and those with 25+ years of recovery and so much more. About half of us have been incarcerated, attended in-patient substance abuse treatment or been homeless.

We live in 55 different zip codes around Houston. We've put in over 13,000 volunteer hours serving people in our city last year. We also served 1,200 meals to homeless in our Church Under the Bridge ministry. Last year we invested over 2,700 volunteer hours in jails and prisons. Every year we welcome over 1,300 people to our worship service.

control freaks

the homeless

those in school

the mentally ill

workaholics

those released from jail

single parents

those rejected by the church

the unemployed

the lonely

We're back! Beginning June 27 join us back at Mercy Street.

Its going to be different than it was before COVID-19 so get ready. First, please email Deb@MercyStreet.org to let us know you plan on attending the Mercy Street service in person at 5:30PM back at the church. This way we'll make sure we have enough space for everyone.

When we regather on Saturdays, we are emphasizing what we have heard people desire most. "We want to be TOGETHER, in the same room." Therefore, we are recording the service earlier, so we can leave time to interact and encourage one another. In order to meet the highest priority of BEING TOGETHER in worship, we are creating smaller venues. We will be together in groups of 12 – 16 people. After the service, everyone can linger in the parking lot so you can see everyone. (NOTE: we could have prioritized all being in the same room at the same time as the next step. However, we heard people want time to interact. They don't want to be herded in and out in big groups. It's hard to interact if you're in a big room spread out. Therefore during July we are trying this approach.)

Below are a few things to keep in mind. This is our next step in returning and we hope you'll join us!

QUESTIONS? ANSWERS.

Q. How do I let Mercy Street know that we will attend worship on Saturdays at 5:30PM (beginning June 27)?

A: Email Deb@MercyStreet.org with your name and the names of anyone else who will be with you. Everyone is going to have to sign in so you might as well do it before you arrive!

Q: What if it fills up before I get there?

A: This is why its important to email Deb to let us know you're coming! Email her now.

Q: Once inside can we sit where we want?

A: Yes, the chairs are set up in a way to adhere to the social distancing guidelines and since we're meeting in smaller rooms (not the fellowship hall), there is limited capacity in each room. Chairs are together with appropriate space in the front, behind and sides between the next pair of chairs.

Q: Will there be childcare, children's or youth ministry activities?

A: Initially, there will not be childcare or children's ministry activities. Families (including young children) are welcome to worship together. We value our kids and we're working to get our Kidz & Youth programs back up and going as soon as possible. Our youth will gather in a room for their lesson or are welcome to be with their parents.

Q: Will I be asked to wear a mask to attend the worship service?

A: Yes. Wearing a mask is an expression of love for neighbor. We ask you put on your mask when exiting your vehicle, before entering the building. Yes, it's summer and it's hot but this is one way we can be a safe harbor to one another. Please wear your mask. If you don't have one, we have disposable ones available at the church, to pick up when you arrive.

Q: Do I have to wear a mask for the entire worship service?

A: No. While that would be cool, once you are seated, you may remove your mask if you desire. We ask that you put the mask back on before exiting.

Q: What do I need to do to exercise precaution while worshiping?

A: Worshippers are encouraged to practice personal responsibility and safety by wearing

face masks as you enter and exit, not shaking hands, not hugging, not lingering for conversations in gathering areas, and continuing to social distance. Its going to seem odd for a little while but we'll find ways to make people feel right at home while continuing to socially distance from each other.

Q: Where should I park?

A: The main entrance is our usual one: Parking Lot B, Entrance #7. We'll have fellow Mercy Streeters there to help direct you to a room.

Q: Where will the worship service be?

A: We're back at Chapelwood UMC (11140 Greenbay, Houston, TX 77024) but we're meeting in several small rooms instead of meeting in the Fellowship Hall for the next several weeks. Just come through the main entrance and we'll help you get where you need to go.

Q: How will the worship spaces be cleaned and disinfected?

A: All areas will be fogged with a disinfecting mist before and after each worship service.

Q: Will there be cookies, coffee and other beverages?

A: We know you enjoy the great cookies but unfortunately we won't have cookies for a while. Also, beverage stations will be closed at this time. Water fountains will be covered with plastic and not available for use. Stop at Starbucks on the way or bring your own water. You'll be alright.

Q: Will restrooms be available?

A: Yes. Use them.

Q: I feel weird being around people, is the Mercy Street service still available online?

A: Yes! Check out <u>Facebook</u> or <u>click here to watch it live on our website</u> at 5:30PM every Saturday from now until for-ev-ver.

Q: I'm feeling sick, can I just come and sit in the back?

A: Please stay home if you're sick or have been sick or have been around anyone sick. Do not come if you have a fever – anything over 100.4 degrees – or exhibit other symptoms, such as chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, loss of taste or smell. We'll be happy to connect with you online. You can watch the service online and Zoom or chat afterward.


Q: Why can't the worship service be like it was before?
