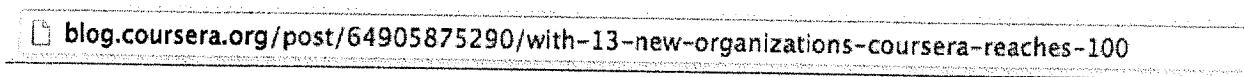

Coursera is now partnered with two of Brazil's top learning institutions (our first university partners in Latin America) to bring online courses to over 215 million native Portuguese speakers in Brazil and around the world.

Brazil's top two public universities, the University of São Paulo (USP) and the State University of Campinas (UNICAMP), will develop courses targeted at Brazilian learners in high-demand topics from entrepreneurship to finance. The Lemann Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting social change in Brazil through education, will create teacher professional development courses targeting K-12 teachers. In collaboration with volunteers through Coursera's Global Translator Community, the Lemann Foundation has also led the translation of additional courses, tripling the number of classes available with Portuguese subtitles and bringing the number of courses available in Portuguese to 28 by the end of the year!

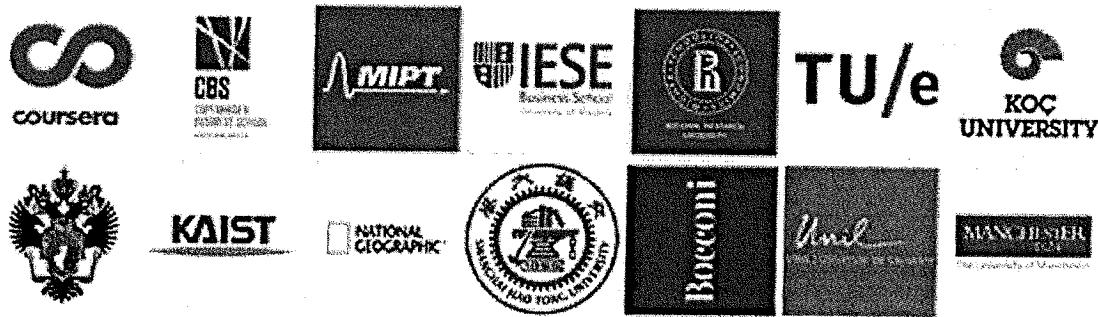

We've been piloting the program for a few months and results have been good! We use sophisticated analytics to automatically find and match student community members and make an introduction with potential employers.

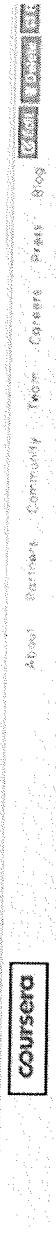

Max B was enrolled in an undergraduate business degree at Cook Institute of Technology in Ireland. But soon realized he was more interested in data and programming in his senior year. He came across Courseera and decided to get acquainted with R programming as part of the Data Science Specialization.

After a few different courses in his back-pocket, he applied for a summer internship at Google. Standing out from the rest, he was selected to come onsite. His interviewer was impressed with his knowledge of R programming and asked him how built his skills. Max mentioned Courseera, and it turns out, the interviewer had also taken the same NCSCC 105. He ended up exceeding expectations and acing the internship.
